Effective 9/8/2011, St. Luke's Laboratory will upgrade the in house CA 125 testing. St. Luke's Laboratory is committed to a Lean, automated system, providing state of the art instrumentation and test methodologies. With this methodology change, we recommend two specimens be drawn to help aid in clinical evaluation, an initial specimen to establish a baseline on this methodology and specimen one to two months for follow-up.

Advantages to the Test Methodology Change include:

- Expanded Reportable Range: The new test methodology will produce more consistent results across a wider reportable range.
- Turn Around Time: Our patients will be better served by shorter TAT for CA 125 testing.
